The "*Sixth Imperial Legion of Rome*" is the part of a living history organization that recreates the life of Soldiers, Barbarians, and Civilians in the desert frontier during the early 1st Century A.D. The Legion was stationed in Syria, near Antioch, and later in Judea from 138 AD to 230 AD.

The nickname "Ferrata" or "Ironsides" was awarded to the Legio VI during the fighting in Gaul under Julius Caesar. The "Fidelis Constans" or "Loyal and Steady" was awarded sometime in the 1st Century AD.
